Saint Vincent Pallotti

Our life is: To breathe God in and out. To find God in everything. To reveal God to all.

(1795 - 1850) Feast day: January 22 Patron Saint of the Catholic Apostolate Center and Vatican II

Born in Rome in 1795, Vincent was ordained a priest in 1818. He possessed an exceptional love for poverty and penance and was especially devoted to St Francis of Assisi. Vincent worked with the poor of Rome, establishing trade schools to help them improve their material condition. His apostolic zeal is ascribed to the foundation of the Pious Society of the Missions, also called the Pallottine Fathers. The purpose of the society was to arouse faith and charity among Catholics and unbelievers. Vincent placed the organization under the protection of the Immaculate Mother and under submission to the Holy See. He died on January 22, 1850. His body was exhumed 100 years after his death and was found to be completely incorrupt. He was beatified in 1950 and canonized in 1963.

Saint Gonzalo Garcia My good friend, God be with you

(1556 - 1597) Feast Day: February 5 Patron Saint of the Archdiocese of Bombay and the Diocese of Vasai

Born of a Portuguese father and a native mother in Bassein (now Vasai) in c 1556, Garcia was trained under the Jesuits in his early years. At fifteen he left for Japan to join the mission efforts of the Jesuit fathers. Garcia served as a catechist for eight years in this mission field.

He then betook himself to Alacao to set up a trade. His business flourished but Garcia yearned to be religious. Eventually, he joined the Franciscans. The Japanese shoguns suspected the missionaries of sedition and had them excised. On February 5, Garcia was crucified on Nagasaki Hills with twenty-six of his companions. On June 8, 1862, Pope Pius IX declared Garcia a saint.

Saint Patrick

Christ be within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me. Christ to win me...

(c 385 - 461) Feast Day: March 17 Patron Saint of Ireland, Invoked against snakes and sins

Called the 'Apostle of Ireland', Patrick was born in Roman Britain. At fourteen, he was captured by pirates and taken to Ireland as a slave. In captivity, Patrick turned to God and with His Grace escaped at the age of twenty. On returning to his family, Patrick joined the seminary and was ordained priest by St. Germanus. Later Patrick was appointed Bishop and was sent to preach the Good News to Ireland. St Patrick is best known for using the shamrock to explain

the mystery of the Holy Trinity. After preaching for forty years, working miracles, living in poverty,

traveling, and enduring much suffering, St Patrick died on March 17, 461.

Skills for Animators' Training

Our Archdiocese has been initiating ways to build not only strong and engaging Parishes but also focusing on SCC's – Small Christian Communities.

The Vision Statement has at its core the axiom: "NO ONE IN WANT" - our Mission aims to make a shift from Small Christian Communities to Small Human Communities.

This makes the SCC Animators training even more intriguing, since the focus – bringing communities, at the same time clusters together, has been signaled! Parishes across Mumbai, Navi Mumbai, Thane – Animators, Coordinators and even a Parish Priest attended. What's interesting to note is the statistics that we have 124 Parishes in our Archdiocese and 11 Deaneries.

The SCC Animators training was spread across 2 days – 28th and 29th October, with Bishop Barthol welcoming the 57 trainees from various Parishes. This included a gamut of activities-Gospel sharing, communication, networking with cells and associations, working in clusters [with a stress on animators and community coordinators focusing towards



building strong personal relationship within clusters] and strengthening communities with emphasis on "No One is in Want" there by helping to maintain and sustain SCCs.

Exercise psychologist Tom Collingwood has written extensively on the relationship between faith and physical fitness. He points out that the way Jesus and his disciples lived their daily lives as described in the Gospels serves as an excellent example of a healthy body-mind-soul integrated lifestyle. To understand more, scroll through the scriptures or try listening to the Bible in a Year Podcast by Fr Mike Schmitz.

4. Attitude of Gratitude

While many things in life seem beyond one's control, counting one's blessings will always bring peace. You can also practice gratitude the artsy way. Start a doodle diary, where you draw or sketch little symbols or images representing what you're thankful for.

5. The Marian Way

Pope Francis began the new year by urging us to entrust ourselves to Mary, the Mother of God and our mother. 'Mary knows our needs; she intercedes to make grace overflow in our lives and to guide them to authentic fulfillment. Brothers and sisters, all of us have our shortcomings, our times of loneliness, our inner emptiness that cries out to be filled. Each of us knows this well. Who can fill our emptiness if not Mary, the Mother of fullness?'

As we step into the New Year, we pray for a year filled with God's grace, for opportunities to deepen our faith, strengthen our hope, and enkindle our love so as to live in a blessed present and create a beautiful future. Happy 2024!
